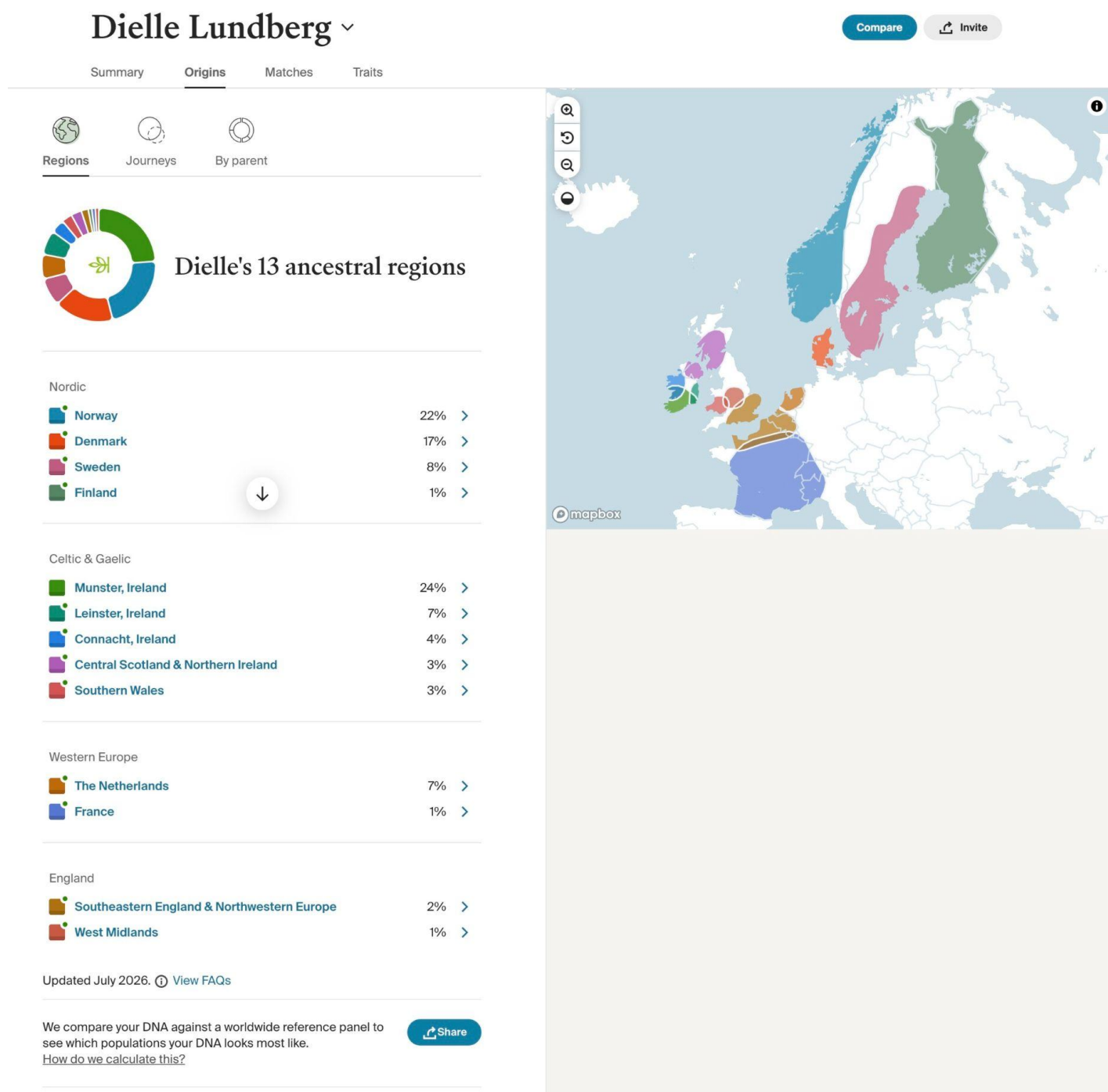
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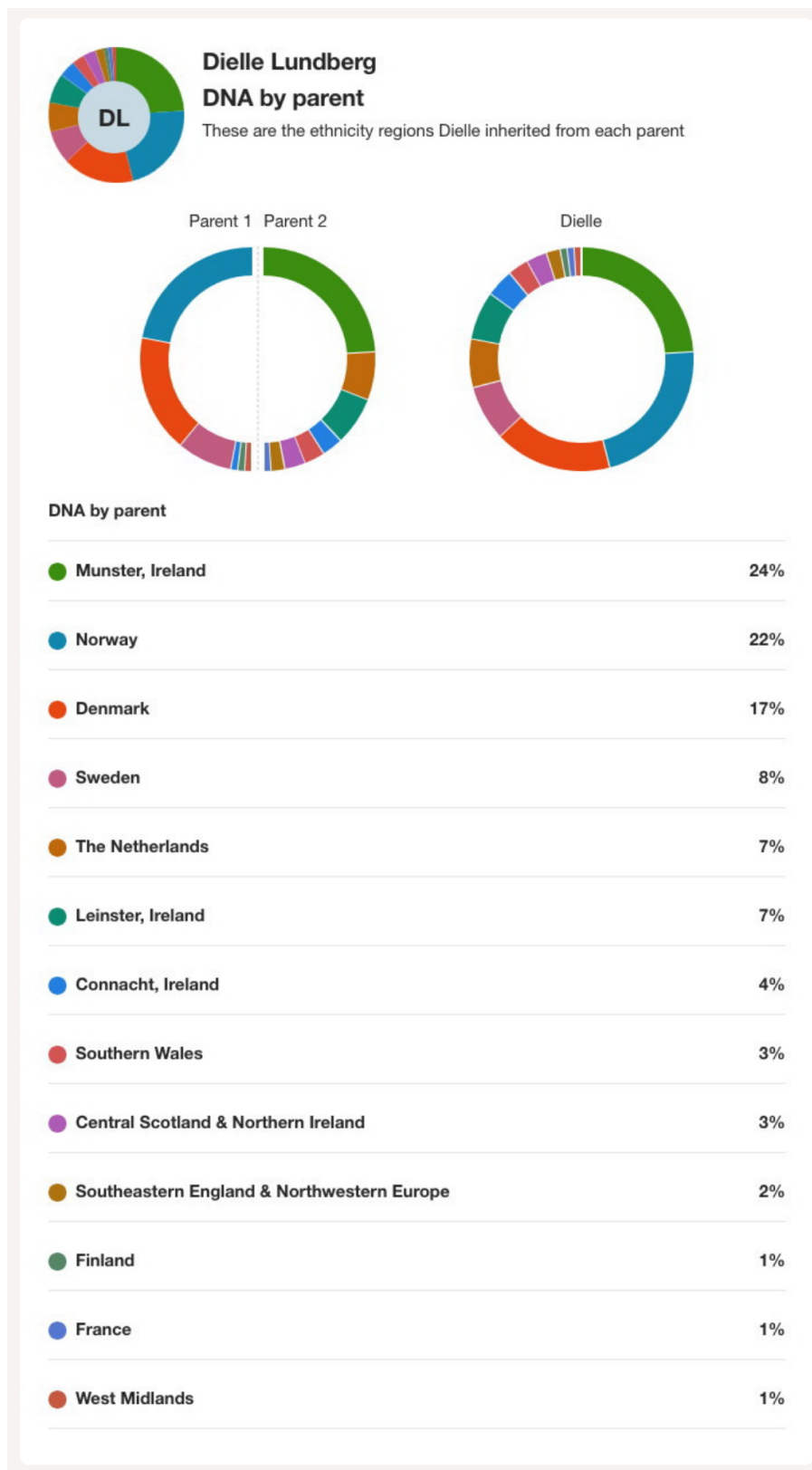
Exhibit 1. Ancestry Description Excerpted from Barbara Louise Hermann's Memoir*Miss Barbara's Story*

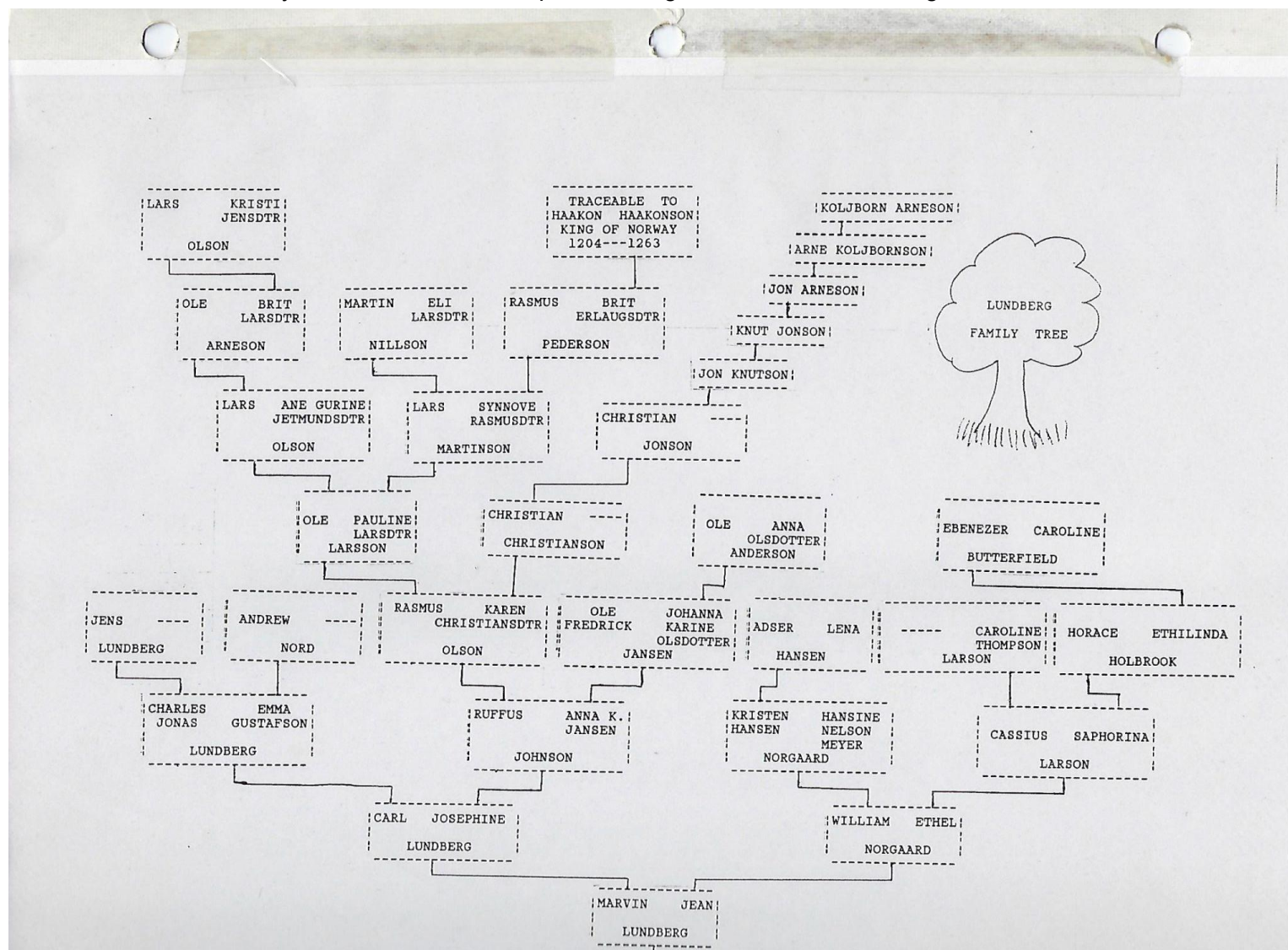
Exhibit 3. Maternal and Paternal Genetic Populations Identified Through Genealogical DNA Test

These migration routes (which AncestryDNA labels 'ancestral journeys') are inferred by clustering genetically similar samples from the millions of other AncestryDNA tests and analyzing the family-tree data associated with those clusters. The patterns reported are intended to reflect migration over the 5 to 20 most recent generations. Oral family history and genealogical records identify Parent 1 as my paternal line and Parent 2 as my maternal line.

Last Rites Held
For Carl Lundberg

Carl Rudolph Lundberg was born on July 1, 1888 in Lincoln county, the son of Charles and Emma Lundberg. He spent his entire life in this county; baptized, and later confirmed, and always a member of Elim Lutheran church near Ivanhoe. On January 4, 1915, Mr. Lundberg was united in marriage to Josephine Alma Johnson. This union was blessed with six children, one of whom died in infancy and Theodore Alphons of Hendricks, Carl Melvin of Windom, Elvera Virginia of Willmar, Florence Alma of Tyler, and Rudolph Marvin of Rapid City, So. Dak. Mrs. Lundberg was called to rest at the early age of 36 and therefore left Mr. Lundberg and the family of five children.

On November 17, 1934 Mr. Lundberg was united in marriage to Martha Johnson. The family was again given a mother and also a sister and daughter, Ione Delpha of Tracy, California, child of Martha Johnson. Later this union was blessed with two children, one who died in infancy and Lilyce Marie. Again the loved wife and mother was called to her eternal home. He was also preceded in death by his parents and a brother.

Mr. Lundberg, a farmer all his life was fond of fishing, hunting and sporting events. He also took a keen, active, understanding interest in public affairs. He was elected and served as state secretary of the Minnesota Farmer's Union for many years. In this capacity Mr. Lundberg was one of those who fought staunchly to put the farmer and his family in a better economic position. Carl Lundberg believed strongly that agriculture and farmers were entitled to a 'fair' share of the

Exhibit 12. Excerpt from *Early History of Lincoln County* About Elim Lutheran Church**ELIM LUTHERAN CHURCH, ASH LAKE**

The Elim congregation of which Mr. and Mrs. John Nelson and family were charter members, was organized in November 1885. Other charter members were Hans Lavesson, Gustaf Lovestrand, Andrew Erickson, Charles Lundberg, Aron Brynelson and their families. Rev. A. P. Satter was the first minister. The site selected by the majority of the members for the location of the church and cemetery was in the northeast corner of section 8, Ash Lake township. The cemetery was incorporated in the Augustana Lutheran Synod of America in the fall of 1887. The building of the church, however, was delayed; hence the minority of the members (John Nelson was one of these) built a church, in 1888, on their selected site in section 5 on John Nelson's farm, or one mile west of the other site. This church became known as the West Elim church.

In 1889 the majority group erected a church on their site (the northeast corner of section 8) and this became known as the East Elim church. Before the completion of the churches, worship services were held in the various homes, but mostly at John Nelson's. Thereafter, the services were held alternately in the two churches. The Swedish language was used exclusively.

Exhibit 13. Excerpt from *Early History of Lincoln County* About Ash Lake Township**ASH LAKE TOWNSHIP**

Ash Lake is one of the four townships within Lincoln county where- of the earliest official records are unavailable and the data from which this brief history is written was obtained from later official records, biographies and various other sources.

John Nelson was the first settler in the township and gave the lake which is located within its boundary the name of Ash Lake from the fact that there were so many ash trees skirting the border. From the lake the township took its name. The township was organized in 1879. Hans P. Paulson was the second settler in the township and assisted in its organization, serving as chairman of the board of supervisors for one term. Jacob Wickersheim also participated in its organization and attended the first meeting which was held in a small building located in section 19 used as a frontier store. Mr. Wickersheim was elected the first treasurer. David L. Phipps also participated in the township's organization and was one of the first supervisors. Hans Lavesson came to the township in 1878 and presumably took part in its organization, afterwards serving as a member of the board of supervisors and township clerk for several terms.

A meeting of the town board of Ash Lake was held on January 31, 1881 to consider a petition for the establishment of a public highway within the borders of the township. This petition was signed by D. L. Phipps, R. Kennen, J. Wickersheim, Fred Judd, F. N. Manchester, J. W. Ardell, Charles Lundberg, J. H. Jackling, Solomon Derby and William Evans. This seems to be the earliest public record available. The order designating the establishment of the highway was signed by J. H. Jackling, H. Lavesson and D. L. Phipps, supervisors.

Thorsten Johnson, a son of John Nelson, was the first overseer of road district No. 1 and Lars Johnson, a brother, was the first overseer of road district No. 2. John H. Cook came to the township in 1876 and also assisted in its organization.

Morse's store was located in section 19, Ash Lake township, adjacent to Shaokatan lake. At the time of the establishment of this store it was thought there was a probability that the railroad from Tracy west would be built up to Marshfield, the county seat, and thence west through Ash Lake and Shaokatan townships and on to Brookings. These hopes were dashed on the road being built to Lake Benton and thence west.

Charles J. Lundberg, well known pioneer settler and for many years a citizen of Ash Lake township, passed away last Thursday afternoon, January 22nd, at 3 o'clock, death occurring at his home in Minneapolis. He had attained the age of 79 years, 3 months, and 28 days at the time of his death.

The remains were brought here where the last rites were conducted Sunday afternoon from the home of his son, Carl R., and at Elim's Lutheran church, Ash Lake, of which the deceased was one of the founders, and internment was made in the church cemetery. Rev. L.W. Yost, pastor of the church officiated, and paid an eloquent and fitting tribute to the life of the departed. Pallbearers were the four surviving sons, Carl R., Theodore W., E. Wilhelm, and E. Alphons, together with Adolph and August Lovestrand.

Charles Lundberg was born in Skone (sic), Sweden, Sept. 24, 1851, and came to America in his youth. On March 13, 1881, he was united in marriage to Emma Gustafson, of Redwood Falls, Minnesota. They were among the pioneer builders of Lincoln county and shared the labor of building a home and developing a fine farm in Ash Lake township. He was a well known figure in the towns and country of this section, a conscientious

and tireless worker for community uplift. His energetic spirit, linked with others of kindred mind, founded and built the Elim Lutheran church congregation. During his later years he made his home in Minneapolis.

The home was blessed with seven children, one son having passed away four years ago. At the time of his death, besides his wife, he is survived by four sons, Carl R., Theodore W., E. Wilhelm, and E. Alphons Lundberg and one daughter Ellen H. Lundberg all of this community, and one daughter, Miss Signe M. Lundberg who has remained in the home of her parents in Minneapolis, and for whose faithful services of love to them the other children are deeply grateful. He is also survived by eleven grandchildren.

Mr. Lundberg's health, in the main, had been very good and showed a remarkable physical and mental strength until the very last, in spite of the very severe stroke which came upon him some weeks before his departure.

During all of his life he had shown an unusual vitality both of body and mind and there was that about his personality which radiated a strength which one always felt in his presence. He preferred the simple things and the simple way of life.

Seldom has it been our duty to record so sad a death as that of Mrs. C.R. Lundberg, who passed away at her home in Ash Lake township early last Thursday morning, as mentioned briefly in these columns last week. Death following premature childbirth of a baby girl which succumbed about twenty-four hours later. Mother and babe were laid away after funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon from the home and Elim Lutheran church, at which few, if any, eyes were not moistened by tears as the remains were viewed for the last time by the husband and surviving children, mother, sisters, brothers, and friends. The infant babe was placed in its mother's arm and at her bosom in which tender position both were laid to rest in the cemetery of Elim church.

The last rites were attended by one of the largest assemblages ever witnessed at a similar service there, with nearly four hundred people present, of which but one-half were able to gain entrance into the edifice. Rev. L.W. Yost officiated and delivered a sermon that touched the heart of all who heard him, as well as paying a beautiful tribute to the departed mother who had been so suddenly removed from the midst of family and friends in the prime of life.

Mrs. Lundberg figured in a serious automobile accident a

few weeks ago, in which she was severely injured, and which accident was the contributing factor in her untimely death. Although she had been released from the hospital, the shock and effect of the accident was too great to withstand and her weakened condition resulted in premature childbirth and subsequent death. A dark gloom was spread over the entire community when it was learned that death had called her to the eternal home. She passed away at 5 o'clock in the morning on Thursday, Nov. 12, and likewise her infant daughter, Joyce Ann, born at 8 o'clock the day previous, died at 9:30 a.m., four hours after her mother's death.

Josephine Alma Johnson was born March 16, 1895 in Ash Lake township, being at the time of her passing 36 years, 8 months and 3 days of age. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Rufus Johnson, and on January 4, 1915, became the bride of Carl R. Lundberg, also of Ash Lake, and they took up residence in Diamond Lake township in which community they resided five years and then moved to the present home three miles south of Ivanhoe.

This union was blessed with the following five children, who, together with the husband, are left to mourn a loving wife and mother: Theodore Alphons, Carl Melvin, Elvira Virginia, Florence Alma, and Rudolph Marvin, ranging in ages from 16 years to 1 year, and the infant, Joyce Ann, who joined her mother in death as above noted.

Mrs. Lundberg is further survived by her mother, Mrs. Anna K. Johnson, of Walnut Grove, Minn., and five brothers and six sisters, she being the first of seven sisters to be called home. Her father and one brother have preceded her in death, the former about three years ago and the latter a year ago.
